

The Associational VBS team prepared for several months to present the annual associational VBS Clinic and Preview that was held March 13, 2018 at First Baptist Church in Moncks Corner.

Wanda Mitchum gave ideas of what the children could do to participate in Children's Ministry Day that was held on Saturday, Feb.17. I feel so blessed to be able to serve the churches of Screven Baptist Association. We have some great servants of the Lord in our midst and great opportunities to advance the Kingdom of God.

During the last several months I have had the privilege of preaching in several churches. I was also privileged to speak at Changed Lives Ministry. I try to be available to do Bible study there monthly. Changed Lives Ministry is a greatly needed ministry and much more successful at helping the alcohol and chemically dependent than secular treatment. They are now expanding their ministry to include a Women's division.

We have continued serving some of our pastors through a spiritual enrichment opportunity. A group of eleven pastors and staff plus Bobby and myself have been reading the book <u>Gospel Fluency</u> and meeting once a month to discuss the content we are reading. We recently completed that book and are seeking the Lord's direction for our next challenge.

In March we hosted a prayer conference called Developing A Powerful Praying Church. Rick Fisher with Blackaby Ministries. The dates were March 12-13. On the evening of March 12, the topic was "My House Will be Called a House of Prayer". On the 13th there were three sessions titled, "The Leader's Prayer Life", "Praying for Those We Lead" and "Developing a Culture of Prayer in the Local Church". We hope this will begin a movement of powerful prayer in our churches. We had good attendance at each session.

Also, in March, I participated in the annual VBS training clinic. I conducted a class for Pastors. The session was entitled, The Pastor as Leader, Encourager, and Participant in VBS. We had eight pastors in attendance. I also had the privilege to be one of a group that led the group in prayer at the concluding gathering of the clinic.

In March. I became the bi-vocational pastor at Knightsville Baptist Church. I am very grateful for the opportunity to actively pastor a church again. I will continue my ministry at the Association alongside pastoring Knightsville.

I also continue to minister at Haven Oaks Apartments. I conduct a weekly Bible study there on Thursday. I am also part of a team that conducts a Homework Club Monday and Tuesday afternoons for elementary

-aged children in the apartment complex. We have a tremendous opportunity to invest in peoples' lives in a meaningful way and share the Gospel message.

I continue to review material related to the development of leaders and disciples. I am currently reading several books on these topics as well. Also, at our DOM's direction, I am gearing up to offer church revitalization assistance and resources to our churches. More will be shared about this in the coming months. I always stand ready to come along side any of our churches to assist in developing leaders, teachers, deacons and disciples etc. Please feel free to call on me.

I want to personally thank you for your prayer concerns about my recent eye surgery. I had two earlier surgeries, one last December and the other in January to remove corneal lesions from both eyes. Both of these surgeries were necessary to prepare my eyes for cataract surgery. I had the cataract removed from the left eye on March 6. Recovery has gone well. I am scheduled to meet with my surgeon on April 26 to discuss removal of the cataract in my right eye. I am grateful for your continued prayer support.



Since the beginning of January 2018, I have visited 19 churches, preached in four of our churches, consulted with one church on transitional pastor, attended part of the Associational VBS Clinic, and attended the "Developing a Powerful Prayer Ministry in Your Church" conference sponsored by the association. Later in April, I will participate in the installation service for Reverend James Holliday at Knightsville Baptist Church. James will continue to serve as our part time Director of Leadership Development. Also, North Trident welcomes their new pastor Reverend Nathan Morton. He will begin his duties in May.

Currently, our association has four churches that are seeking pastoral leadership. They are First Baptist Holly Hill, Limestone, Old St. George, and Pleasant Grove. Sangaree Baptist Church merged with Sovereign Grace Church of the Charleston Baptist Association. Sangaree is no longer a member of Screven Baptist Association. Also, Compass Church, a new church reaching active adults 55 years and older, is closing at the end of April. This new church started in September 2016 and met at Cane Bay Elementary School. Dr. Gary Lee has served as Pastor.

Our Associational Mission Trip to Baltimore, MD is scheduled for May 9-13. Twelve people from three of our churches will participate. Team members are Randy and Karen Burns (Old Fort), Harry and Nadine Hanner (Brookhaven), Alex Meade (Providence), David Mullenix (Providence), and Bobby and Mary Ellen Bailey (Old Fort).

Also, Joe and Terron Miller (Old Fort) and their two children will join the team in Baltimore. Joe is a chaplain with North American Mission Board and Terron is a travel nurse. They live and work in New Hampshire. Our team will assist Pastor Nehemiah Cole and his team at Agape Praise Fellowship. We will host a Teachers' Appreciation Day at Patterson High School and Essex Elementary School, student ministry at Patterson, prayer walking, and community evangelism...
